The setting:

A tranquil experience with nature, or a base for your adventures, Antechamber Bay Ecocabins offer you:

- A superb and naturally beautiful location
- A magnificent beach and the Chapman River only metres away
- Environmentally friendly and self sustaining accommodation
- Walking trails amongst beach sand dunes and native Tea Trees
- Cosy Ecocabins as a base for touring, adventure or relaxing
- Private campsites and communal shelter shed with cooking facilities

Each Ecocabin includes:

- Accommodation for up to 8 people (double bed in bedroom 1, two double bunks in bedroom 2 & fold-out futon sofa bed in living area)
- Slow combustion wood heater (wood supplied)
- Undercover deck with barbecue
- Low energy South Australian made fridge(70L)/freezer(16L)
- Solar powered lighting and rainwater
- Gas 2 burner stove & grill, kettle oven
- Kitchen with basic cooking and eating utensils (8 person settings)



Amenities Centre:



Both cabins and campers share eco-amenities centre which is a locally and uniquely designed shower and toilet facility boasting latest alternative energy concepts and clever 'Aussie feel.

Equipment Hire:

To help make your holiday even more enjoyable, we hire out two single kayaks/one double kayak with lifejackets. Kayaks are shared between guests on the property. Also you can bring your own linen or hire ours!

Activities:

Our property is a great place for:

- Kayaking on the Chapman River
- Fishing (river & beach)
- Water activities
- Walking trails including Historic, Penguin, Wallaby and Bird-watching walks
- BYO outdoor activities

Prices: Minimum 2 night stay in cabins.

Prices are always very competitive and depend on the time of year and number of guests. Off-peak starts from \$180 per cabin for 2 nights for 2 adults.

Special discount rates apply for 7 night bookings and returning visitors!

Camping fees start at \$7 per adult and \$4 per child per night during offpeak season.

Eco features of the Property

Power for the fridges and lights is generated from solar panels on the unique Amenities Centre. Rainwater is collected from all buildings and stored in a series of interlinked tanks for use in the cabins and Amenities Centre. Hot water for showers is solar heated. The toilets are self-composting with solar powered fans to make your experience a pleasant one. These toilets are odourless!

Historic Area

Antechamber Bay, named by Matthew Flinders, has quite a colourful history. There are many historical sites of interest in the area, including an historic marker for the last full-blooded Tasmanian Aboriginal woman who lived and died in this region, remains of an old jetty that was used by the sealers in the 1800s and grave sites for early settlers in the area dating back to the mid- 1800s. The nearby Chapman River has been used by locals for over 100 years to relax and unwind.

Fishing

Whiting can be caught off the beach year round at Antechamber Bay with mullet and salmon often in abundance around Xmas and Easter. A deep-sea aquatic reserve has been proposed approximately 100m out from the shore to protect the unique underwater features in the area.



Birds and Wildlife

There are more than 260 species of birds that have been recorded on the Island. Antechamber Bay is home to many of these including the Superb Blue Wren and Crimson Rosellas. The property is also home to many Tammar Wallabies and Rosenberg Sand Goannas.
